Engagement/Outreach Programs in the News

She took a few moments to navigate through the site and encouraged ELC members to provide information/stories related to engagement to include on this new site. Susan believes this is a great platform to elevate the significant number of engaged scholarship projects that are underway across the university.

Alumni Awards for Outreach Excellence

Jan Helge Bohn and Farida Jalalzai shared information related to the various outreach excellence award programs that are currently seeking nominations. These included the Alumni Award for International Excellence and Alumni Awards for Outreach Excellence. In addition, Susan shared information related to the upcoming AP Faculty Awards program.

Engaged Scholar Network

Cris Thompson shared information related to the development of a graduate certificate program in community engaged scholarship and provided an overview of the initial meeting of the work group. Lynnette Overby, University of Delaware, met with the group and provided an overview of the work that has been done to establish the Graduate Certificate in Community Engagement. The work group will reconvene in January to discuss next steps.

Carnegie Foundation 2026 Elective Classification for Community EngagementSusan reminded the group that Virginia Tech will participate in the 2026 Carnegie

<u>Kristy Collins</u> shared that this is the 14th year for Kids Tech. Registration is currently open. She also provided an update regarding the CENI partnership – Hokies for a Day program.

<u>John Provo</u> provided an update from a recent visit to Hampton Roads and the Black Brand organization.

<u>Farida Jalalzai</u> – UCIA recently heard a presentation by the Center for Refugee, Migration, and Displacement Studies (Katie Powell) and learned more about a Fall 2023 Study Abroad program in Paris.

<u>Kristin Gehsmann</u> – announced that Brenda Brand is working with a select number of K-12 after school robotics outreach programs.

<u>Craig Arthur</u> is currently working with seven undergraduate students and has received a CENI seed grant to build a recording studio at Radford High School.

<u>Meghan Weyrens Kuhn</u> shared that there are currently three searches underway in VT Engage and discussed the Civic and Democracy Leadership Initiative/Civic Leadership Academy.

<u>Nicole Akers</u> provided an update regarding a graduate certificate in data analytics and Regional Innovation + Tech Hub proposal.

<u>Scott Weimer</u> provided an update regarding various professional leadership programs and encouraged members to identify emerging leaders in their areas to consider future participation. He also provided an update about a partnership with Roanoke City Schools and the Plato program for 2, 3, 4th graders. Scott provided brief comments regarding a partnership established by Carillion, Roanoke Valley Addiction Recover, Virginia Tech, and Visit Virginia's Blue Ridge. Potential programs include a major conference in Spring 2024 around the recovery eco-system as well as the development of a Trauma Informed Care short course.
